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
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

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

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Where the sea sings and the mountains

The allure of travel is often found in the unexpected, where cultures converge, landscapes enchant, and every moment tells a story. My recent journey to Batumi, the jewel of the Adjara region in Georgia, was a symphony of such moments—a perfect blend of adventure, relaxation, and discovery.

The journey began like all great adventures do—with a sense of wonder, an open heart, and a hunger for discovery. As we left behind the chaotic symphony of New Delhi for the tranquil allure of Georgia, I had little idea how much this trip would transform my understanding of beauty, history, and the art of living.

A whisper from the Black Sea

Our late-night flight landed in Tbilisi, the Georgian capital, where the air felt like a refreshing pause—a stark contrast to Delhi's urban chaos. A six-hour drive awaited us to reach Batumi, the glistening port city of Adjara. The journey began under a veil of rain and darkness, but I didn't mind. There was something poetic about traveling through the unseen, letting the sounds of the rain and the occasional curves of the road guide your imagination.

By the time we arrived in Batumi, dawn had just begun to kiss the Black Sea. The first glimpse of the waves crashing against the shore from my hotel balcony was pure magic. The sea seemed alive, its melody carried by the cool Georgian wind that filled the room. Rain continued to dance on the glass, but instead of dampening the mood, it added a dreamlike texture to everything. Batumi had made its quiet introduction, and I was already entranced.

The art of Khachapuri and the stories of Adjara

After a much-needed nap and an energising cup of coffee, we headed out to our first adventure: an Ajarian khachapuri cooking class at Alaverdi Restaurant. Here, the charismatic Chef Gia Agirba welcomed us with a warm smile and a story about how

he patented his unique technique for crafting the iconic Georgian dish. Making khachapuri is more than just cooking—it's a dance. Rolling the dough, filling it with cheese, shaping it like a boat, and finally sliding it into the wood-fired oven felt like participating in a ritual passed down through generations. The best part, of course, was breaking into the golden crust to let the molten cheese and butter swirl together. Every bite was a reminder that simplicity, when done with love, can be profound.

The culinary journey was followed by a visit to the Khariton Akhvlediani Museum, a quiet treasure trove of history. As we walked through its halls, artefacts spoke of Adjara's layered past, from ancient trade routes to Soviet-era relics. The juxtaposition of these stories against the rhythmic sound of rain outside

gave the experience a melancholic yet enchanting vibe.

Dinner that evening was a poetic affair at an Ajarian-style restaurant. Candlelight flickered as a live piano performance wove its notes into the gentle murmur of conversations. The rain outside had turned colder, but inside, the warmth of Georgian hospitality wrapped around us like a cozy blanket.

Of snowflakes and song in the mountains

The next morning greeted us with a familiar companion—rain. But far from being an inconvenience, it seemed to set the stage for what would be one of the most magical days of the trip. Our first stop was the Borjgalo Ethnographic Museum, the masterpiece of Kemal Turmanidze. This museum wasn't just a collection of artefacts; it was a living storybook.

Miniature dioramas of Georgian life, crafted with meticulous detail, depicted everything from village weddings to wine-making traditions. Turmanidze himself was there, a humble genius who spoke about his creations as if they were his children. He said, "This is more than art. It's life, frozen in time."

From there, we journeyed to Chateau Iveri in Varjanisi. The road twisted and turned through lush landscapes, and as we climbed higher, the rain transformed into something extraordinary. First came the hail, sharp and fleeting. Then, as if nature had decided to surprise us, snowflakes began to fall.

Watching the rain give way to snow was like witnessing a painter change their palette mid-creation. The world around us turned white, soft, and silent—a winter wonderland in the middle of autumn. By the time we reached

the chateau, the snow had transformed the vineyard into a scene straight out of a fairy tale. Inside, warmth awaited in the form of wine, song, and stories. Folk singers dressed in traditional Ajarian attire performed polyphonic melodies that seemed to echo off the chateau walls. The wine tasting that followed was equally lyrical, with each pour accompanied by tales of the vineyard's heritage. A hearty Georgian lunch capped off the experience, leaving us full—both in body and spirit.

The waterfalls and the fairy-tale bridge

The journey back to Batumi was anything but ordinary. We stopped at the Mirveti Waterfall, a hidden gem tucked away in a lush forest. The sound of cascading water mixed with the scent of wet





earth, creating an ambiance that felt otherworldly.

Nearby, an ancient stone arch bridge stood like a guardian from another time. Covered in moss and framed by vines, it looked like it had been plucked straight from the pages of a fantasy novel. Crossing it felt like stepping into another dimension, where the lines between history and myth blurred. The rain followed us, persistent and poetic, as if reminding us that it too was part of the story. By the time we reached Batumi, twilight had painted the city in hues of gold and grey.


A city of infinite stories

The Carlton's revolving door turns and turns, cutting the opulent air into four equal parts - Folly, Mystery, Wonder, Fascination...!

Quite a handful! But there's a history to it all, and thereby hang several grand, romantic tales, as I found much to my delight.

Landing at Nice Airport, deposited smack between the bluest of seas and a maze of gleaming white villas, I didn't have an inkling of what was to come. Thirty minutes drive past low hills, still more luxury villas with red tiled roofs and the proverbial swimming pools, and stretches of deep blue sea, and I'd arrived at my haloed destination.

It didn't take me long to see that Cannes is one smart town. Though smaller, it bears an uncanny resemblance to Nice, sporting a similar classy image. Showing off their tall masts, hundreds of sailboats dotted the harbour.

My arrival...! What can I say...! Courteously met and ushered in by a concierge with an immaculately pressed white suit, for a deluxe check-in at the fabulous Hotel Martinez, seemed quite the appropriate thing. The fact is that the hotel is as famous as the town itself, which is rightly dubbed the 'world's glamour center.'

It's worth lending an ear to the town's history, and I did. In 1834, one Lord Brougham, prevented from continuing his journey into Italy, stumbled onto what was then a sleepy little Roman outpost. His brief halt started a lifelong devotion to the lovely little coastal town, becoming the first chapter in a spellbinding chronicle of glamour, glitz and fame.

Curiosity among local townsfolk going about their business, greeted Cannes' first visiting sophisticates. Yet within a few years the little town overlooking the marshlands thick with Cannae reeds (hence its name) was to become the world's most photographed, liveliest and brightest star.

Once the monopoly of the British gentry, local secret delights embraced the world! A glittering parade of trans-European kings, princes, archdukes, and consorts converted the town into an enchanted domain studded with fabulous, luxurious, exotic villas and palaces.

There was a 'larger-than-life' quality to Cannes in those heady days. Legends were born. Princely palaces sprang up all over town under the magical wand of architect Laurent Vianney, the undisputed master builder of the day. In the Villa Escarras, Dutch aristocrat Baron Lycklama, had his residence transformed into an Oriental palace for a single night's musical entertainment.

The decades flew by as in a dream. The royal yacht 'Britania' often anchored in the bay. The summer casino was built. In his atelier in the Villa Fiesole, Jean-Gabriel Domerque painted Josephine Baker. And Rolls and Bugattis slid through the dusk to the famous night playgrounds.

Fortune smiled on many: Aime Maeght met Pierre Bonnard at a gala hosted by Maurice Chevalier. There were tragic times, like Isadora Duncan, dancer of the veils, tragically strangled to death by her own billowing scarf. There were breathless times. Like Rita Hayworth leaving Orson Welles and marrying Ali Khan because she 'couldn't live with a genius'. And there were glittering times. Like Grace Kelly and Cary Grant on location with Alfred Hitchcock to shoot, 'To Catch a Thief'. And Sophia Loren and

Gina Lollobrigida who had only to appear on a balcony to start a riot. On a quieter note, a young amateur painter called Winston Churchill could often be spotted on the Quai Saint-Pierre.

Though I didn't know it then, just stepping into and out of the Martinez makes you a minor celebrity, for there is only one Martinez. And only one La Croisette, among the world's most famous promenades, and the domain of the rich and famous. And of course, there's only one Cannes, the world's undisputed glamour citadel.

Doing my tourist bit, I took several customary walks along the famous promenade. For ceremony's sake I poked my head into some half a dozen chic little boutiques, and duly stopped by at the Carlton, before settling down

at a corner café whose tables spilled out onto the pavement, sipping a glass of white wine that 'became the weather and me' according to attending waiter. The legendary blue Mediterranean has made sailing one of the Cote d' Azur's great pleasures. If you can manage it, hop on to a private yacht. I did, and my foray afforded several delights as we bobbed amidst a maze of colourful sailboats and friendly tourists who seemed to do nothing but wave and drink.

I museum-hopped, starting off at Musee de la Castre that takes you on a fantastic world tour, from the archaeology of the Mediterranean basin, to ethnology and primitive art in all five continents. I then stopped by at Musee de la Mer, which unfolds the world of underwater

archaeology and also shows the 'Man in the Iron Mask's' famous cell. The town's considerable fame got a further, huge boost through the highly-rated, top of the cinematicladder, annual film festival, The festival brings in international and Hollywood stars, and they bring in hordes of upscale tourists.

Riding on its glamourous legacy, Cannes grew and glittered, and the legacy lives on. Today as yesterday, the chronicle rolls on in an endless whirl that still spells pure magic. The old quarter of Le Suguet still watches over the sun and star-struck city. La Croisette is still one of the world's most famous promenades.

It's a story without an end. But I haven't heard anyone complain.





Another highlight was the leisurely lunch at Alila Spice Garden. My room, nestled opposite this lush garden, gave me glimpses of it every morning on my walks. The garden itself is a treasure trove of fresh produce used in the resort's kitchen-everything from pumpkin flowers to aromatic curry leaves. Chef Mohammed, with his warm smile and clear passion for the garden, crafted an exquisite meal for us under the swaying palms. The burrata was soft and fresh, paired with pesto pasta that was as fragrant as it was delicious. The entire meal was infused with the earthy freshness of ingredients picked straight from the garden just a few steps away. The simplicity of the setting-sun filtering through the palm fronds, the gentle rustle of leaves-combined with the vibrant flavours on our plates, created a culinary experience that was as soulful as it was delicious.

From the moment I sat down for my first meal at Yakitori, I knew I was in for a gastronomic journey that would leave an indelible mark. At Yakitori, the skewers were a true masterpiece. Grilled to perfection, the delicate char on the meat and vegetables delivered that quintessential umami punch.

Breakfast at Alila Kothaifaru was no less impressive. Each morning began with a mimosa in hand, the first sip signaling the start of a new culinary adventure. The sheer diversity of dishes at breakfast was striking. One morning, I indulged in a Pav Bhaji that was surprisingly authentic for being served in the Maldives, its spiced, buttery flavors transporting me momentarily to the streets of Mumbai. On another, I opted for a Mexican omelette, bursting with fresh peppers, cheese, and the right amount of heat to wake up the palate. The breakfast menu was meticulously curated, allowing for a different experience each morning, all while enjoying the stunning views of the ocean.

Another highlight was the dinner at Umami. When the black cod miso arrived, it was like an ode to perfection. The fish flaked apart at the slightest touch of my fork, its buttery texture giving way to a delicate sweetness from the miso glaze. Each bite was a medley of flavors—silky, sweet, and slightly smoky, with just enough umami to round it off. Paired with a crisp white wine, the dish felt like a culmination of everything Umami stood for-elegance, balance, and sheer culinary brilliance. Every meal here was a true masterclass in gastronomy.







When I heard about the chance to join a familiarization trip to Greece, with a special focus on Athens and Rhodes, I had already started packing my bags. Our first stop, of course, was the iconic Acropolis, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This ancient hilltop citadel is home to the Parthenon, a monument of the classical spirit and an impressive feat of Greek architecture. It's hard not to be awe-struck when standing beneath its columns, marvelling at structures crafted in the 5th century BC.

But as much as Athens is about ancient ruins, it's also about lively modern experiences. After a day filled with historical sights, we dined at The Dolli which was just a stone's throw away from the Acropolis, where I discovered a newfound love for variety of Greek delicacies. But the highlight was the view. From The Dolli, it almost felt like you can reach out and touch the Acropolis itself. In that moment, I wasn't just a traveller; I was a part of something timeless.

A hop-on cruise along the Saronic Islands was next on our list, a 'must-do' for those craving authentic Greek experiences. We visited Hydra, Poros, and Aegina - each with its own unique personality. Hydra enchanted us with its charming harbour and traffic-free cobbled streets, while Aegina tempted us with freshly harvested pistachios and quaint shops. The clean,





crystal-clear waters here were like nothing I'd ever seen. Swimming in these seas felt like plunging into the heart of Greek mythology itself.


Island of the sun

After Athens, we took a short flight to Rhodes, a gem in the Dodecanese islands. Known for its medieval charm, Rhodes exudes a mysterious allure that combines the best of historical intrigue and natural beauty. We checked into Grecotel Dama Dama - a resort of luxury and Greek hospitality wrapped into one. The beach views alone could keep you entertained for days, but we had a medieval city to explore. The old city of Rhodes felt like straight out of a historical epic. We walked down the Street of the Knights, marvelling at the fortress-like structures built by the Knights of St. John during the Crusades. The Palace of the Grand Masters, a striking castle-turned-museum, holds centuries of stories and is an unmissable spot for any history lover. Every cobblestone seemed to echo with tales of past crusaders, and I half expected a knight to appear around each corner.

Rhodes got em' all!

Rhodes also offered a treasure trove of local cuisine and shopping. Strolling through the local market, I found vibrant olives, honey, spices, and hand-crafted souvenirs. Greek food here was another revelation – Greek Salad, Tzatziki, Souvlaki, and Baklava became our daily indulgences. The Roc Club, where we stayed in Rhodes, gave us an authentic taste of Greek hospitality that only added to the warmth of our experience.

And for those with a spirit for adventure (or those who can't resist an ocean view), the day trip to Simi Island is well worth it. Sailing on the Aegean for about an hour and a half, we reached Panormitis and the Monastery of Archontas Michail Panormitis, a revered site dedicated to the Archangel Michael. Legend has it that sailors who lost their way at sea would be guided back by the Archangel - a rather fitting story for an island that feels like a mythological haven.



City of stars

Rhodes by night, as I soon discovered, has a different charm. The Casino Rodos, nestled in the heart of the city, offers not only gaming thrills but also the elegance of old-world luxury, making you feel like a character in a James Bond film. Beyond the casino, the nightlife in Rhodes is a mix of traditional tavernas and modern lounges, allowing visitors to taste both Greek culture and a bit of indulgence.

Though the Colossus of Rhodes a statue of the Greek Sun-God Helios and one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World - is long gone, its spirit still looms large over the island. We also had a unique experience of watching 'Throne of Helios' – The History of Rhodes in 9D animation so beautifully presented that it not only entertains the kids but also amuses the adults.

One thing that I can assure to all the prospective travellers to

Greece that it is not just about Athens and Santorni Island which are the first thing that come to mind while planning a visit to Greece, but there is a lot to explore in Rhodes along with Athens, which can broaden the experience of travel to Greece and can add to the memorable take-aways.

By the end of our trip, Greece had lived up to every expectation and surpassed many. I came for the history and the monuments, but I left with memories of flavours, sights, and laughter. Greece, with its scenic islands, legendary ruins, and genuine hospitality, is more than just a travel destination - it's an experience that lingers.



Mahakumbh 2025: Where Spirituality Meets Tradition and Adventure



Since ancient times, saints across India have engaged in deep spiritual practices, or sadhana, striving to connect with the divine and praying for world peace. The tradition of collective prayer and unity runs deep in Indian heritage and continues today through vibrant festivals and spiritual gatherings. Of these, the Mahakumbh stands out as the pinnacle, a sacred event occurring every 12 years that is among the world's largest spiritual gatherings.

Millions of pilgrims from around the world gather at Prayagraj, the sacred confluence of the Ganges, Yamuna, and Saraswati rivers, known as the Triveni Sangam. This revered gathering is steeped in the symbolism of ancient Indian texts, which recount the cosmic battle between gods and demons for the elixir of immortality. Bathing in the waters of this confluence during Mahakumbh is believed to purify the soul, bringing devotees closer to salvation and liberation.

Mahakumbh is hosted in rotation between Haridwar, Ujjain, Nashik, and Prayagraj every 12 years, creating a powerful blend of spirituality and cultural diversity. This monumental event serves as a unique bridge to inner transformation and offers visitors a deep look into India's living traditions, making it a pilgrimage unlike any other.

In January 2025, Prayagraj will once again welcome the Mahakumbh, with extensive preparations already underway. The Uttar Pradesh State Tourism Development Corporation (UPSTDC) is establishing a "tent city" at key areas like Arail Ghat, Parade Ground, and Jhunsi, offering around 2,000 tents in categories from basic to luxurious, and ensuring that pilgrims can enjoy both comfort and spiritual retreat. Moreover, special accommodations are being made for the Akhadas representing different monastic orders; these spiritual organizations bring an added dimension to the Mahakumbh's sacred atmosphere.





One of the key rituals of Mahakumbh is the series of seven important snans, or ritual baths, each with its own deep significance. The first snan is scheduled for January 13th, known as Paush Purnima, a full-moon bath associated with the pursuit of moksha (liberation from rebirth). On January 14, the Makar Sankranti snan—the first Shahi snan, or royal bath—will occur, where spiritual leaders symbolically lead devotees in taking the holy dip to mark the sun's northward shift. Other major snans include Mauni Amavasya (January 29), Basant Panchami (February 3), Magh Purnima (February 26), each representing unique blessings and significance on the journey to spiritual awakening.

In addition to these ritual baths, Mahakumbh offers visitors a rich cultural experience. A wide array of indigenous and local cuisines will be available, giving visitors the chance to savor the authentic flavours of the region. Complementing this is a series of yoga sessions, offering pilgrims a rejuvenating opportunity to align their physical, mental, and spiritual selves. Yoga, renowned as an integral part of Indian culture, will play a significant role in providing inner peace to all who attend the Mahakumbh.

Another beautiful cultural component of Mahakumbh will be the bhajan sandhyas, or evening devotional music performances, where the uplifting sounds of traditional music fill the air with tranquility. For those seeking adventure, Mahakumbh 2025 will have something special to offer: helicopter joy rides will give visitors an exhilarating aerial view of the grand Kumbh Mela grounds and the holy Sangam, providing a unique perspective on the enormity of this sacred congregation and the captivating landscape of Prayagraj.

Adventure lovers can also engage in water sports along the banks of the rivers. The area surrounding Prayagraj boasts a number of revered temples, including the famous Hanuman Temple and Mankameshwar Temple, each adding to the city's spiritual depth. These sacred sites allow visitors to explore Prayagraj's rich cultural history and enhance their journey with moments of deep spiritual connection.




The Festival of Lights




Celebrating Divine Femininity






